Amid the rugged cobblestones in the white-hot meatpacking district, Honor exudes Italian cool. Aesthetic Movement principals Lisa Ano and Jesse James envisioned the fashion label's first boutique as an elegant foil for industrial surroundings. After examining Honor's clothing and concept boards, the pair found corollaries in gold-leafed glass tile, apricot-colored silk velvet, and other luxurious elements, which now mingle with vintage and custom furnishings.

Past the foyer of the 2,100-square-foot store, a pair of steel ribbon stairs flank a floating platform dedicated to formal wear, then ascend to a salon anchored by a 1950's sofa. At the rear, sunshine cascades from a skylight. Down in the darker basement, a library proffers a curated assortment of current and vintage books. ➤
